

Biography Of George Haywood

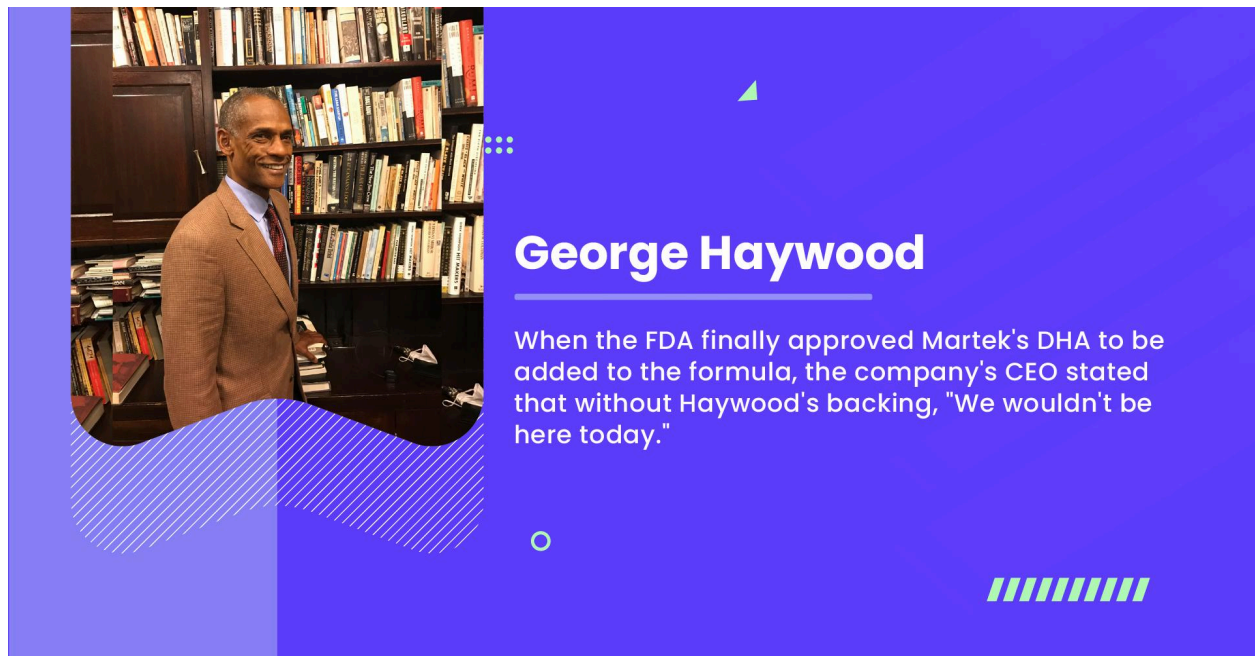

Notable Contributions

His investment insight played a crucial role in the success of companies like XM Satellite Radio (now Sirius XM), Martek Biosciences, and AVI BioPharma (now Sarepta). His involvement with Martek, in particular, revolutionized infant nutrition by introducing the crucial brain nutrient DHA into infant formula. DHA is abundant in human breast milk but was not in the formula before Martek's breakthrough. When the FDA finally approved Martek's DHA to be added to the

formula, the company's CEO stated that without his backing, "We wouldn't be here today." It is estimated that hundreds of millions of babies worldwide have experienced improved cognitive development by consuming formula boosted with Martek's DHA.

Philanthropic Endeavors



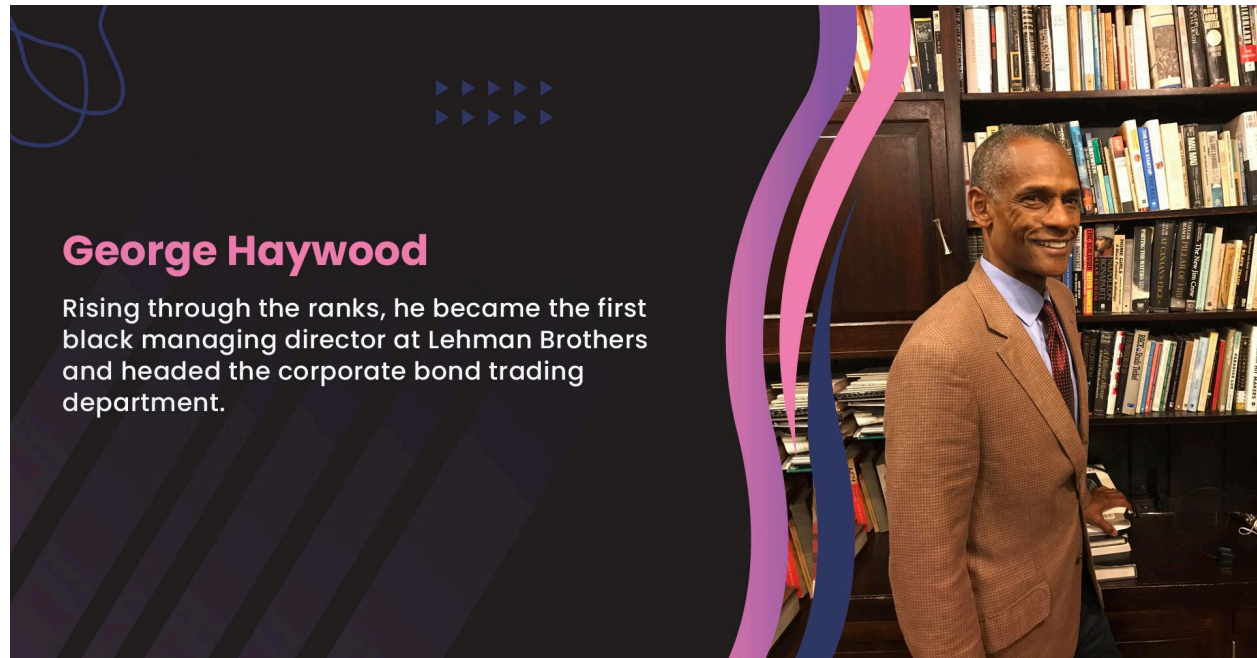
Educational Support
