Jeremy Rosenholtz is an American educator, administrator, and writer whose professional career spans more than three decades in independent schools across the United States. His work reflects a steady commitment to English education, student development, and college guidance. Over time, his responsibilities expanded from classroom teaching to senior leadership, yet his focus has remained on supporting students and strengthening school communities through consistent and thoughtful service.

Early Life and Intellectual Curiosity

Raised in Laramie, Wyoming, Jeremy developed an early interest in reading, writing, and academic inquiry. His upbringing encouraged independence and reflection, fostering his interest in language and ideas. These early experiences played an important role in shaping his later approach to teaching, particularly his ability to connect with middle- and upper-school students in a clear and supportive manner.

Undergraduate Study and Academic Discipline

Jeremy Rosenholtz pursued his undergraduate education at Amherst College, earning a Bachelor of Arts in English in 1991. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa and received an Amherst College Merit Fellowship for graduate studies. Graduate Training and Leadership Preparation

His graduate studies focused on literature, pedagogy, curriculum development, developmental psychology, and learning differences. Seeking to deepen his understanding of educational leadership, he completed additional coursework at Teachers College at Columbia University. During this time, he also participated in the Klingenstein Summer Institute Fellowship at Deerfield Academy, which provided practical preparation in private school administration.

Editorial Experience and Entry into Teaching

Before entering education full-time, Jeremy Rosenholtz worked as an assistant editor at Penguin Books in New York. For two years, he managed book projects from acquisition through final publication, gaining valuable experience with editing, organization, and long-term project management. He later transitioned into teaching, beginning his classroom career at St. Andrew's School in Florida, where he taught English and founded the school's Speech and Debate program. Under his leadership, the program achieved national recognition within three years.

Long-Term Service at Fieldston School

In 1997, Jeremy joined the Ethical Culture Fieldston School in New York, where he remained for seventeen years. During that time, he served in multiple roles, including English teacher, college counselor, middle school team leader, dean, and trustee. His long tenure reflected institutional trust and a willingness to take on varied responsibilities as needed. While at Fieldston, he cofounded and directed the Fieldston Summer Service Institute, an academic and service program for underserved seventh- and eighth-grade students in the Bronx. The program's impact was later recognized in *The New York Times*.

College Guidance and Continued Teaching

After a one-year teaching appointment at Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts, Jeremy joined Newton Country Day School. From 2015 to 2024, he served as Director of College Guidance while also teaching AP English Literature and middle school English. In this role, he worked closely with students and families throughout the college admissions process and oversaw the school's senior projects program, balancing administrative oversight with direct instructional engagement.

Life Beyond Professional Roles

Today, Jeremy Rosenholtz lives outside Boston with his wife, two daughters, and a Golden Retriever. Family life remains central to his daily routine, including supporting his daughter's participation in competitive chess tournaments. In 2024, he published his first novel, *Your Biggest Fan*, which received favorable reviews and national recognition. He continues to write while remaining deeply connected to education, viewing both pursuits as complementary expressions of a lifelong commitment to learning and thoughtful communication.
