



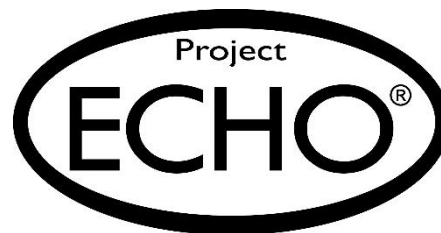

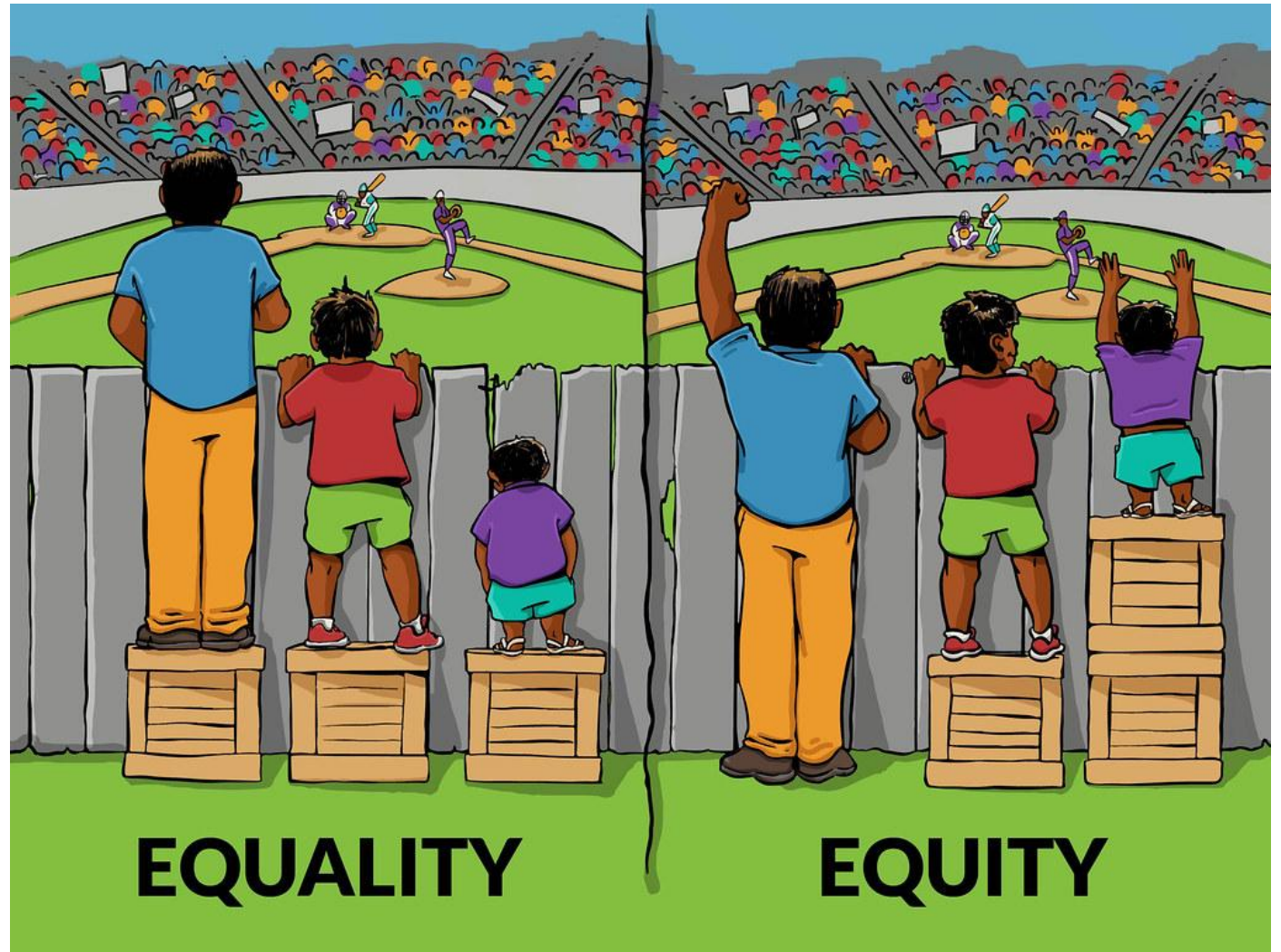

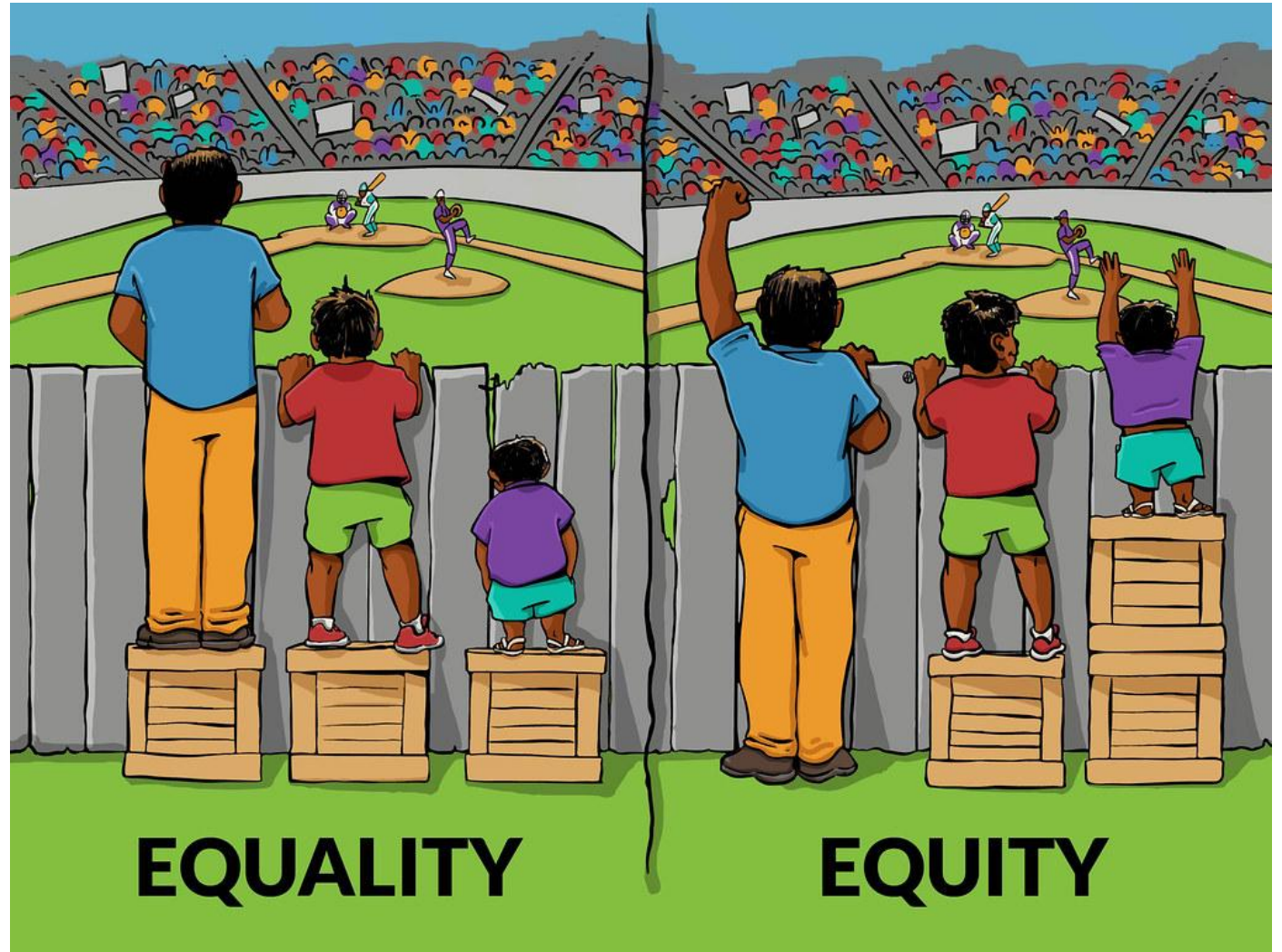


Health Equality means

3. Health Care Access and Quality
4. Neighborhood and Built Environment
5. Social and Community Context
